## **WHO WE ARE**

With a service area that encompasses the entire Eastern Shore of Virginia peninsula, Tangier Island VA and Smith Island in Somerset County, MD, A&N Electric Cooperative serves over 38,000 connections and operates over 2,400 miles of power line. The cooperative services a variety of residential, commercial and industrial accounts with a large member base of homes, some commercial developments, and agricultural enterprises.

A board of directors, elected by the membership, guides the cooperative. Board members are elected to one of four election districts. Directors serve three-year terms.

Each August, A&N Electric Cooperative holds an annual business meeting. The meeting provides co-op members the opportunity to meet the management of the cooperative, review the annual report and elect directors. Members who do not attend the Annual Meeting may participate in the election process through the return of their proxy ballots.



# WHERE THE DOLLAR GOES



#### WHAT IS MEMBERS HELPING MEMBERS?

Members Helping Members, Inc. is a community non-profit 501(c)(3) organization and was established to assist families needing assistance in paying their electric service bills.

Thanks to our generous local community, over \$330,000 has been applied to members' electric bills since 2009. Over 2,200 members are currently contributing over \$2,800 monthly in amounts ranging from under \$1, with our round-up option, to as much as \$10.

The Accomack and Northampton County Departments of Social Service determine qualified candidates for assistance in the program. To be eligible a family must be at or below 133 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines; they must have a delinquent electric account of more than \$50, and may receive assistance only once in any given calendar year.

If a family qualifies, they may be eligible for up to \$250 in assistance.

A&N Electric Cooperative, in cooperation with Members Helping Members, Inc., secures funding through voluntary donations through the Cooperative's electric service bills. Members of A&N Electric Cooperative who would like to donate to the program may do so by checking a box on their electric service bills.

The cooperative also matches a funding grant from Co. Bank to help support the program.



## **LIGHTING THE WAY ANNUAL REPORT**





A&N Electric Cooperative employees have always been committed to our community by supporting local causes.

In 2019, we organized and created an employee non-profit organization, Lighting the Way.

Lighting the Way has empowered co-op employees to highlight community needs and organize support for those needs.

Since its inception, Lighting the Way has raised money through internal fundraising, partnered with the Foodbank of the Eastern Shore to assist with its backpack program, and adopted two road ways for litter pickup, one in each county, through the Virginia Department of Transportation's Adopt-A-Highway program.
